Dear 4-H Camp Leaders,

You are invited to submit a proposal for the 2002 National 4-H Camping Institute. Enclosed is a copy of the Call for Proposals. Ohio is pleased to be hosting this important Institute. Your proposal(s) may be submitted by snail mail using copies of the form, OR we recommend that you submit electronically by accessing the web site www.ohio4h.org/nci.

The Institute will be held at Recreation Unlimited which is located thirty-five minutes northeast of Columbus, Ohio. It is a state of the art camping facility designed and built to be totally accessible. Although they primarily serve campers with physical and developmental disabilities, since opening in 1989, many "temporarily able bodied" campers have enjoyed the full service camping facility.


As in past National 4-H Camping Institutes, there is no budget for a stipend or travel expenses for presenters. The cost of the Institute will be \$225.00 for the "early bird" registration and more for those who register after December 1, 2001. The registration materials will be out by the end of August, 2001. This fee will include registration, lodging and meals for full time participants.

The Keynote Speaker will be our friend and mentor Michael Brandwein. Michael is a well known presenter at local, regional, national and international conferences for all types of youth development professionals in general and camping professionals in particular. His presentations are high energy and provide original, practical, and specific techniques and materials that you - can take home and use immediately with your camp staff and other audiences. In addition to the keynote, Michael will facilitate two workshops.
