A flashlight and batteries, a marker and strapping tape. (Boxes may be available to put things in that will not fit in your suitcase & you'll be able to get them home.)

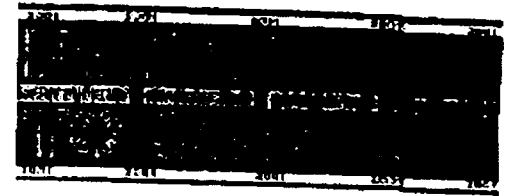
Weather:
